Structure of Assessment

Pre-1st Semester Assessment: Formative assessment to evaluate students' learning progress before the 1st semester.

1st Semester Examination: Summative assessment covering the first half of the academic syllabus.

Pre-2nd Semester Assessment: Mid-term evaluation to monitor academic growth and provide necessary feedback.

2nd Semester Examination: Final assessment covering the entire academic session.




